History of the Blue Star Banner

The history of the Blue Star Banner leads us back to World War I and Army Captain Robert L. Queissner. Captain Queissner designed this service flag to represent his two sons who were serving on the front line during this war.

The Blue Star Banner became an unofficial way to show that your family had a child in the services. Over time, the flag has transitioned to simply represent any family member who is serving

in the Armed Forces at a time of war or hostility.

In 1918, President Wilson added, from a suggestion by the Women's Committee of the Council of National Defense, that if the family member was lost while serving that the blue star was to be covered with a gold star. The blue would be symbolic of hope and the gold would symbolize sacrifice for freedom.

In World War II the Blue Star Banner became very popular and could be seen in almost every window in which it was applicable. The Banner is traditionally hung in the window of a home as to allow all who pass the residence to view it and know the family has a member at war.

It is also a common practice to hang an American flag with this banner, but the American flag is to be of equal or larger size and is to hang above the service flag.

Spotlight on Rev. Gary D. Ginn, Redeemer Presbyterian Church

"We want to invest in people rather than bricks and mortar." That was the philosophy of Christ Community Church (CCC) PCA located at the corner of Garden St. and Carpenter Rd. just west of I-95 in Titusville.

Just a few short years ago, CCC was at an impasse. God had begun to really grow their ministry. The church was running out of space quickly: Sunday School classrooms, youth group facility...everything was getting cramped. It's a good problem to have, of course, but how do you create more space for people? Two thoughts came to mind: either build more space to accommodate the overflow or send people out to start a new work in the gospel. Because CCC's overall philosophy was one of advancing God's kingdom rather than their own, they chose to "plant" a church rather than build one.

In August 2006, Rev. Gary D. Ginn, his wife, Lori, and their three children along with nine families from CCC began meeting, planning, and praying weekly for God to do something special in and through them to get Redeemer Presbyterian

Church off the ground. And God, in his infinite wisdom and grace, brought this to pass.

On February 24, 2007, Redeemer Presbyterian Church held its first public worship service. Since that time, God has continued to bless Redeemer and has doubled its size.

Currently, about 75 people worship regularly at Redeemer, and God's

presence and power are being witnessed and experienced in worship, in the context of small group communities that meet throughout the week, and in community service projects like Get Free Brevard that reach out to the often overlooked and marginalized in our neighborhoods.

The most fundamental thing we stress at Redeemer is the gospel.

We believe that there's not one person who's so sin-sick, no relationship so broken, and no institution so corrupt that it can't be redeemed by God's amazing grace.

As a person comes more and more under the influence of the gospel of God's grace in Christ, it becomes infectious. It's like a bubbling brook, fountain, or waterfall. It saturates the whole of a person's life. And it's for that reason that it also has such a powerful effect, not just at an individual level, but also a community level. As individuals are changed by the gospel message, so also are families, neighborhoods, towns, cities, and so on...that's why we chose the motto: The gospel changes everything! And we're committed to working with God to see the whole cosmos renewed, starting right here in south Titusville and Port St. John," writes Pastor Ginn.

Captain Mark Reed is in the U.S. Army and serving his 2nd tour of duty. He is deployed north of Baghdad in Iraq. Mark has a lovely wife, Rebecca, and two daughters Andra, 3, and Charlette, 1, who currently live in Orlando, Florida.

After graduating, in 1994, from THS and also from UCF in 2001, Mark chose to serve his country. He now uses his organizational skills in Ordinance dealing with shipments and packing. He also teaches and serves on the MITT team which consists of only 11 other men.

Often they go out on missions for five days at a time; traveling from village to village in three vehicles. There would be absolutely no immediate help if any or all were to find themselves broken down or

ambushed. Mark's mother, Sharon, and his father, Bill, pray daily for their son and his men and keep in touch as often as possible through web cam and by sending weekly care packages.

Sharon always includes candy in her packages because she feels in her own way she is protecting her son. When he and his men walk into what seems to be an empty village, and he places candy on the ground the children begin to come out and surround the MITT team. This is why Sharon says candy represents peace and she finds comfort in sending it. She is so thankful that she is able to do this for them and for her own peace of mind.

May the Lord continue to protect Mark, his men, and all the sons and daughters that pay the price for our freedom. Let us also remember their families that stay in wait paying a price for us also!
